HOW YOU MADE A DIFFERENCE IN MY LIFE

You may not realize it, but you made a difference in my life. Thank you.

Your gifts and good works in support of LSS of Northern California's mission to end homelessness launched me on my journey to self-sufficiency. Let me tell you how.

I had given up on myself. Over the course of 10 years, I had lost my bookkeeping job, my health and a place to live, along and my confidence and dignity. I am HIV+ and my health was poor at the time. My HIV count was high and my T-

cells low.



In 2016, Gavin, who had not rode a bicycle since middle school, took up serious riding when he began training for the 545 mile Annual AIDS/LifeCycle ride from San Francisco to Los Angeles in June. He has gone the entire distance twice!

The event that led me to LSS seemed unfortunate at the time, but in retrospect proved to be divine intervention. I had just been released from jail for shoplifting food at a local supermarket, because I was hungry. I was referred to LSS' Forensic Housing Project at The Kinney Hotel in the Tenderloin neighborhood.

I grew up in a middle class family and never wanted for anything. I had been living on my own in San Francisco since I was 20. You never think that something could get you so depressed that your life would spiral out of control. That people would look at you with no respect if they even suspected you were homeless.

Those first eight months in the Forensic Housing Project were tough, but I needed time, a safe place to live and structure to regain my health and

get my act together. Your support provided food and helped furnish my small room. The compassionate and nonjudgmental guidance offered by my caseworker connected me with medical and dental services that I desperately needed. He helped me enroll in a drug rehabilitation program. Then I spent two years in the LSS Money Management Program to make sure my essential bills

2018 WILDFIRE RELIEF UPDATE

This year California's fire season started earlier than normal, and once again you heeded our call to help our neighbors in Northern California by sending more than \$20,000 to support the short- and long-term needs of residents affected by the fires in Shasta, Mendocino, and Lake counties. Church and community leaders worked together to provide fire victims with \$100 VISA gift cards from Wells Fargo Bank, who waived fees. The rest of the donated funds will support the long-term rebuilding needs of residents of affected counties.

Thanks in part to your support of the 2017 wildfires, 70 grade school children who lived through the October 2017 wildfires attended Camp Noah in Sonoma and Mendocino counties this summer. This specially-designed day camp, created by LSS of Minnesota, helps children who are victims of disaster learn resiliency and preparedness skills.




THE BERKES FAMILY

I'm pleased to report that I work for LSS, having started as the receptionist for the Money Management Program, then moving to a case worker position, to my current job as Office Manager of LSS' San Francisco division.

I feel truly blessed to have been referred to LSS when I landed in jail and now to be part of their work to end homelessness.
