I Can Do This!

As Courtney explains, her parents were "in the life" and that led her and her twin brother to foster care when they were six months old because their drug addict parents could no longer provide care. An uncle, who was a pastor, became a foster father when she turned four. Courtney stayed with him until he passed away. At seventeen, she found herself depressed and struggling to graduate high school. She was also homeless.

Courtney bounced around among friends; however, they often had sinister motives. The friends who offered help coerced her into selling herself to pay her way – and, sometimes, theirs. One day she woke up and said, "Enough!" That is when she reached out to a high school counselor she trusted. Today, she volunteers to speak out against human trafficking, sharing her story with law enforcement, hospital staff and other youth. Courtney is also a college student.

Courtney became a client of LSS in the fall of 2013. She was already employed and on her way to success. She had been living in a shelter but found it difficult because of the shelter's rules. Having her own apartment has strengthened her independence. The social workers who referred Courtney to LSS didn't judge her.

They saw her talent, even when she couldn't. They told her, "You can do this!" And she believed them.

Courtney's case manager, Jonathan, says, "Courtney only leaned on the program for as long as she needed to. She's a go-getter and I see a bright future for her."

Jonathan is right about that. Courtney is taking the next step in her journey and has accepted a paid position to continue the work she currently volunteers for. Community outreach and organizing and public speaking are skills that she is blessed with and she plans to continue to use them to change the world. Go get them, Courtney!

What are Thrivent Choice dollars?

Choice Dollars is a part of Thrivent Choice. What's that? It's a grant program that lets Thrivent members recommend where Thrivent Financial distributes some of its charitable outreach funds.
