Read this before using the list

1. Congressional district lines change on January 3, 2027. Proposition 50, approved November 4, 2025, replaced California's congressional map. The new lines apply to the November 3, 2026 election, but every current member serves the OLD district through January 2, 2027. This list reflects who represents each county today. A summary of the 2027 changes appears at the end.
2. Proposition 50 did not touch state lines. State Senate and Assembly districts are unchanged and will stay in place after 2026.
3. Two federal seats turned over this year. Rep. Doug LaMalfa (CA-01) died January 6, 2026; James Gallagher won the June 2 special election and was sworn in June 10. Rep. Kevin Kiley (CA-03) now serves as an Independent and caucuses with Republicans.
4. Assembly District 3, covering Tehama County, is currently vacant.

What Changes on January 3, 2027

Under the Proposition 50 map, several of our counties move into different congressional districts. Candidates on the November 3, 2026 ballot are running in the new districts, so campaign-season outreach should use the column on the right. Governing outreach through the end of 2026 should use the column on the left.

The largest shifts affect Shasta and Siskiyou, which move from CA-01 into CA-02, and Solano, which consolidates entirely into CA-08. San Joaquin and Sacramento both become more fragmented.

Federal HUD appropriations posture: National Low Income Housing Coalition, nlihc.org, tracks the THUD bill in detail

One accuracy flag for existing materials

The district brochures in this project describe a 40 percent cut to rental assistance, elimination of the Section 8 voucher program, two-year time limits, and a \$700 million cut to homelessness programs. Those figures came from the FY 2026 President's Budget request. Congress did not adopt them. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2026, signed February 3, 2026, provided \$77.3 billion for HUD, an increase of roughly 12.6 percent over FY 2025. The brochures should be updated before further distribution so LSS is not advocating against a proposal that was already rejected. The live fight is now FY 2027.

Several brochures also list incorrect phone numbers, including Sen. Adam Schiff at Sen. Padilla's number, and inconsistent Appropriations subcommittee chairs. The Statewide and Federal Leadership section above has the verified figures.
