PROTECT HUD FUNDING IN CA-10: Ensuring Housing Stability for Our Communities

What is HUD? Vital Programs for CA-10 The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides crucial support through programs like:

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8): Helps low-income families afford housing.
- Continuum of Care (CoC) grants: Funds homelessness services.
- HOME & CDBG: Supports affordable housing and community development.

CA Central Valley Housing Snapshot (Stanislaus & Merced Counties) Housing Choice Vouchers Serve:

- 4,900+ households via Stanislaus Housing Authority
- 1,500+ via Merced Housing Authority
- Additional households via other local agencies

CDBG-DR Disaster Recovery Funding:

- \$1.6B+ for CA wildfire/flood recovery
- Millions allocated to Stanislaus & Merced Counties
- Crucial for flood protection in Central Valley River regions
- Supports housing, infrastructure & economic recovery

Affordable Housing Projects:

- · Avena Bella (Turlock): 80 units
- 540 Merced (Turlock): 66 units
- Moon Gate Plaza (Modesto): 67 units
- Las Palmas: 81 units for farmworker families

The Housing Crisis in Numbers

- 6,400+ households depend on vouchers
- Housing ↑ 52% since 2020 | Wages ↑ only 16%

The Impossible Gap:

- Avg. voucher recipient income: \$21,500/year
- Living wage (family of 4): \$45,800/adult/year
- Avg. rent (2-bed): \$1,550/month
- 34% of renters spend 50%+ of income on housing

Impact on District Residents, Vulnerable Populations:

- Most earn <30% of Area Median Income (\$23,800/individual, \$34,000/family of 4)
- 20% of public housing units = disabled residents & 21% = seniors
- Large farmworker population with seasonal income and unique housing needs

Rural & Agricultural Community Needs:

- Few affordable housing options in rural areas
- Transportation challenges increase housing cost burden
- Rising rents = displacement of farmworker families



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Time to Take Action!

Threats to HUD Funding Proposed Cuts Include:

- 40% reduction in rental assistance & elimination of Section 8 vouchers
- Two-year time limits for "able-bodied" recipients
- \$700M+ cut to homelessness programs
- Shift to state block grants with weaker protections

If Enacted, These Cuts Would:

- Impact 6,400+ voucher-reliant households
- Put \$1.6B+ in recovery funds at risk
- · Jeopardize projects like Avena Bella, Moon Gate Plaza
- · Increase homelessness for seniors, farmworkers & disabled residents
- Undermine flood protections in high-risk Central Valley areas
