Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 01

Medicaid (Medi-Cal in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

California's Medi-Cal Funding

Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)
\$107.5B Federal funding (62%)
\$37.6B State general fund (22%)
\$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on Rural CA-01

CA-01 spans 11 counties across Northeastern California including Butte, Lassen, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, and Tehama, among others.

High dual-eligible population: CA-01 has 46,300 residents who rely on both Medicare AND Medicaid **Rural nursing home access:** Medicaid pays for 60% of nursing home care - cuts would force facility closures in rural areas

Rural seniors at risk: Many CA-01 seniors moved to the district to stretch retirement dollars and now depend on Medicaid for long-term care

Rural hospitals threatened: Many facilities operate with negative margins and depend on Medicaid reimbursements to stay open
