# PROTECT HUD FUNDING IN CA-09: Ensuring Housing Stability for Our Communities

What is HUD? Vital Programs for CA-09 The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides crucial support through programs like:

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8): Helps low-income families afford housing.
- Continuum of Care (CoC) grants: Funds homelessness services.
- HOME & CDBG: Supports affordable housing and community development.

## Housing Choice Vouchers currently serve:

- 4,800+ households via San Joaquin Housing Authority
- 1,200+ via Stanislaus County Housing Authority (partial district)
- Additional households through other local authorities.

## **CDBG-DR Disaster Recovery Funding:**

- \$1.6B+ in federal funds for California wildfire/flood recovery
- Millions allocated to San Joaquin County
- Vital for flood protection in Delta communities
- Supports infrastructure, housing & economic revitalization in disaster zones.

#### **Affordable Housing Projects:**

- Grand View Village: 75-unit mixed-use project in Stockton
- Hunter House: 74 units for veterans & low-income families
- Conway Homes: Multi-phase public housing revitalization
- Liberty Square: 68-unit affordable housing complex

## The Housing Crisis in Numbers

- 6,000+ district households rely on vouchers
- Housing costs ↑ 58% since 2020 | Wages ↑ 17%

## The Impossible Gap:

- Avg. voucher household income: \$21,850/year
- Living wage for a family of 4: \$46,500/adult/year
- Rent (2-bed avg.): \$1,650/month
- 32% of renters spend 50%+ of income on rent

## **Vulnerable Populations:**

- Most earn <30% of Area Median Income (\$24,100/individual, \$34,500/family of 4)
- 19% of public housing residents are disabled
- 22% are senior citizens

## Flood Risk & Resilience:

- CA-09 includes Delta communities with high flood vulnerability
- Threats from aging levees, extreme weather & sea level rise
- Federal support is essential for levee upgrades & economic stability in agricultural areas

## **Proposed Cuts Include:**

- 40% cut to rental assistance
- Elimination of Section 8 vouchers
- Two-year limits for "able-bodied" recipients
- \$700M+ cut from homelessness programs
- Shift to state block grants with fewer protections



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# **Time to Take Action!**

## If Enacted, These Cuts Would:

- Jeopardize housing for 6,000+ voucher households
- Put \$1.6B+ in disaster recovery funds at risk
- Threaten key housing projects (Grand View Village, Hunter House)
- Increase homelessness among seniors, veterans & disabled residents
- Undermine flood protection for vulnerable Delta communities
