Compiled August 25, 2026. Verified against the California Secretary of State, the State Senate and Assembly rosters, and members' official offices. Covers 22 congressional, 17 State Senate, and 33 State Assembly districts.

How to use this directory

Start with the County Index. Look up a county to get its congressional, State Senate, and State Assembly district numbers, then find those districts in the three directories that follow.

Region: the standard 48-county Northern California boundary. The ten Southern California counties (Imperial, Kern, Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Ventura) are excluded. Say the word if you would rather draw the line elsewhere.

Congressional districts change January 3, 2027 under Proposition 50. Everyone listed serves their current district through January 2, 2027; the new lines apply to the November 3, 2026 ballot. Twenty-five counties are affected; see the appendix. State Senate and Assembly lines are unchanged.

Three seats in flux: Assembly District 3 is vacant. Aisha Wahab won the CA-14 special runoff August 18 and vacates Senate District 10 when sworn in. Rep. Kevin Kiley (CA-03) now serves as an Independent.

The clearest shifts: Shasta, Siskiyou, and Modoc move from CA-01 into CA-02. Sierra and Plumas swap between CA-03 and CA-01. Solano consolidates entirely into CA-08, and San Francisco simplifies to CA-11 and CA-15. Sacramento and San Joaquin both fragment further, each picking up two additional districts. Inyo, Mono, and Alpine move from CA-03 into CA-05.

Still outstanding from the earlier review

The district brochures in this project describe a 40 percent cut to rental assistance, elimination of the Section 8 voucher program, two-year time limits, and a \$700 million cut to homelessness programs. Those figures came from the FY 2026 President's Budget request, which Congress did not adopt. The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2026, signed February 3,

2026, provided \$77.3 billion for HUD, roughly 12.6 percent above FY 2025. The brochures should be updated before further distribution. FY 2027 is the live fight.

Several brochures also carry incorrect phone numbers and inconsistent Appropriations subcommittee chairs. The Statewide Contacts section above has the verified figures.
