**From Car to Apartment:
Shasta County Youth Are Housed**



Kelly is a former foster youth. She and her husband **Dane** joined our Shasta (ACTS) program in Redding, CA in May of 2021 after two challenging years of staying with relatives and living in their car, as well as tragedy.

Kelly and Dane were married in 2019. Although they lived with his parents, both were working and saving money to start a household of their own. Kelly took college classes toward a medical degree. Their dreams seemed to grow even more when Kelly learned that she was pregnant. However, Kelly experienced an ectopic pregnancy, and after considerable pain, Kelly's fallopian tube and her unborn child were removed in a life-saving operation. In addition to her grief, her medical situation resulted in her losing her job. The couple tried to stabilize emotionally and physically. Kelly even started a small business, but in the early part of the COVID-19 pandemic,

they lost their housing. With no affordable housing available, they moved into a car and sometimes stayed with a relative. And Kelly stopped taking classes.

Kelly's college counselor connected her to LSS, and although their Case Manager Marci could not get them housing right away, she was able to secure a hotel room for the couple for the two weeks it took her to secure an apartment. Now, Dane is working, and Kelly is addressing her mental health issues exacerbated by the trauma of the past two years. Her plan is to return to college and expand her business.

"Our experience with LSS has been phenomenal!" says Kelly. "LSS staff are absolutely incredible people. Everyone is kind and down-to-earth."

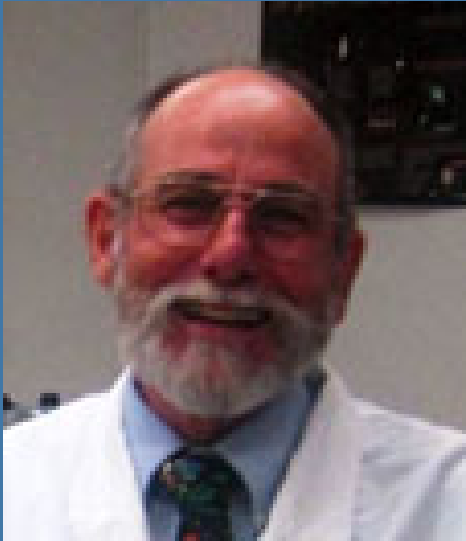
