Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 14

Medicaid (**Medi-Cal** in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

California's Medi-Cal Funding

Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)
\$107.5B Federal funding (62%)
\$37.6B State general fund (22%)
\$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on East Bay CA-14

East Bay workforce vulnerability: CA-14 is located in Alameda County and includes cities like Hayward, Pleasanton, Livermore, Union City, Castro Valley, and parts of Dublin and Fremont where many service workers, hospitality employees, and their families depend on Medi-Cal for affordable healthcare coverage

Diverse suburban communities: The district includes a mix of suburban communities with significant working-class and immigrant populations who rely heavily on Medi-Cal coverage

East Bay healthcare access threatened: Local hospitals and medical centers like Eden Medical Center in Castro Valley, Stanford Health Care-ValleyCare in Pleasanton, and Kaiser Permanente facilities serve substantial Medi-Cal populations throughout the district

Economic divide impact: Despite the area's economic growth, many service workers, hospitality employees, and essential workers in the district depend on Medi-Cal for family healthcare

CA Congressional District 14 Medicaid/Medi-Cal Facts

Total coverage: 210,000 people

This represents 30% of the district's population

An additional **32,000+ residents receive Covered California** premium subsidies Combined, over 242,000 people (**34% of the district**) rely on Medi-Cal or Covered CA subsidies

Estimated enrollment breakdown:

- 74,000 children (18 and under)
- 42,000 seniors and disabled adults
- 94,000 working adults and caregivers

Economic impact: Approximately \$2.5 billion in annual Medi-Cal spending in the district

Healthcare infrastructure at risk:

- East Bay healthcare facilities like Eden Medical Center in Castro Valley and Stanford Health Care-ValleyCare in Pleasanton serve significant Medi-Cal populations
- Community health centers throughout Alameda County rely on Medicaid funding to serve diverse, multilingual communities
- Long-term care facilities serving the region's aging population depend on Medicaid reimbursements

Potential impact of cuts: Up to \$2.2 billion in federal funding losses over nine years if cuts are applied proportionally across districts
