Protect HUD Funding in CA-04: Ensuring Housing Stability for Our Communities

What is HUD? Vital Programs for CA-04 The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides critical support through programs like:

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8) help low-income families afford decent housing.
- Continuum of Care (CoC) grants fund homelessness programs and services
- HOME & CDBG Supports affordable housing and community development.

CA-04 Housing Needs: The Numbers Speak

Housing Choice Vouchers currently serve:

- 13,084 families through Sacramento Housing Authority (payments go to landlords)
- 431 families through Yolo County Housing Authority
- Multiple families through Lake, Napa, and Sonoma County authorities

Affordable Housing:

- West Gateway Place Phase II: 60-unit complex in West Sacramento funded by CDBG
- Le Donne Drive development by Mutual Housing with 108 rental units and 18 singlefamily homes
- 805 R Street project developing 241 affordable units

Impact on District Residents

Vulnerable populations:

- Median income for voucher recipients: approximately \$21,412 per year
- Many households earn less than 30% of Area Median Income (\$24,750 for 1 person, \$35,350 for family of 4)
- 18.24% vouchers used by disabled residents, 19.18% by senior citizens.

Rural community needs:

- Limited affordable housing options in rural areas of Lake, Napa, and Yolo Counties.
- Transportation challenges magnify housing affordability issues in rural communities.
- Agricultural workers and rural families disproportionately affected by housing shortages.
- Rural homelessness often less visible but equally concerning.

Proposed Cuts to HUD Include:

- 40% reduction in rental assistance funding
- Elimination of traditional Section 8 voucher program
- Two-year time limits for "able-bodied" recipients



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Time to Take Action!

- Block grants to states with fewer federal protections.
- \$700+ million cut from homelessness programs.

Impact of two-year time limits:

- Would harm working families who make up majority of non-elderly, non-disabled recipients.
- Rents increased 55% between 2020-2024, making housing unaffordable for workers.
- Creates housing instability, leading to increased homelessness.
- Particularly devastating in rural areas with limited employment opportunities
