Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 02

Medicaid (**Medi-Cal** in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

California's Medi-Cal Funding

Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)

\$107.5B Federal funding (62%) \$37.6B State general fund (22%)

\$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on North Coast CA-02

Rural north coast communities at risk: CA-02 spans Del Norte, Humboldt, Marin, Mendocino, and Trinity counties, with many remote areas dependent on Medicaid

Rural hospital vulnerability: Critical access hospitals serve patients who often travel long distances for care in this geographically diverse district

Vulnerable population reliance: The rural North Coast faces multiple healthcare challenges, including provider shortages and limited access in remote areas

Community collaboration threatened: Local providers rely on Medi-Cal funding to maintain healthcare access and services for rural communities

CA Congressional District 02 Medicaid/Medi-Cal Facts

Total coverage: 238,194 people

This represents 31% of the district's population

An additional 36,500 residents receive Covered California premium subsidies

Combined, 274,694 people (36% of the district) rely on Medi-Cal or Covered CA subsidies

Healthcare challenges:

Almost 60% of people in Humboldt County get healthcare through Medi-Cal or Medicare Critical shortages in healthcare professionals, especially in primary care and behavioral health Limited access to care in remote areas, with some patients traveling 50+ miles for services Rural hospitals operating on thin margins and dependent on Medicaid reimbursements

Potential impact of cuts: Up to \$2 billion in federal funding losses over nine years if cuts are applied proportionally across districts

Current Budget Process

House passed resolution calling for \$880 billion in cuts from Energy & Commerce Both chambers adopted joint budget resolution on April 10, 2025 Committee markups expected in May with final passage targeted **by Memorial Day**
