Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 06

Medicaid (**Medi-Cal** in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

California's Medi-Cal Funding

Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)

\$107.5B Federal funding (62%) \$37.6B State general fund (22%)

\$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on Sacramento County CA-06

- Suburban and urban communities at risk: CA-06 includes north Sacramento, Citrus Heights, Rancho Cordova, and surrounding suburban communities where many working families depend on Medi-Cal coverage
- State government workforce dependency: Many Sacramento-area state and local government workers, contractors, and service employees rely on Medi-Cal for affordable healthcare
- **Diverse suburban population:** CA-06's suburban communities include many immigrant families, young professionals, and working parents who depend on Medi-Cal for family healthcare coverage
- Healthcare infrastructure concentration: Sacramento County hospitals and clinics serve as regional medical centers, with Medicaid funding crucial for maintaining services to the broader metro area

CA Congressional District 06 Medicaid/Medi-Cal Facts

Total coverage: 330,107 people

This represents 44% of the district's population

An additional 27,460 residents receive Covered California premium subsidies

Combined, 357,567 people (47% of the district) rely on Medi-Cal or Covered CA subsidies

Estimated enrollment breakdown:

- 122,140 children (18 and under)
- 62,720 seniors and disabled adults
- 145,247 working adults and caregivers

Economic impact: \$3.96 billion in annual Medi-Cal spending in the district

Healthcare infrastructure at risk:

- Medi-Cal supports thousands of jobs major Sacramento County hospitals like UC Davis Medical Center and Kaiser Permanente facilities
- Community health centers serving diverse Sacramento communities rely heavily on Medicaid funding
- Long-term care facilities serving the region's growing senior population rely on Medicaid reimbursements

Potential impact of cuts: Up to \$3.4 billion in federal funding losses over nine years if cuts are applied proportionally across districts

Essential healthcare services at risk:

- Primary care for 330,107 residents, including many working families
- Emergency services at major Sacramento-area medical centers
- Mental health and substance use treatment
- Long-term care for seniors and disabled residents in suburban communities
- Specialty care at UC Davis Medical Center and other regional facilities

House passed resolution calling for \$880 billion in cuts from Energy & Commerce Both chambers adopted joint budget resolution on April 10, 2025 Committee markups expected in May with final passage targeted **by Memorial Day**
