Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 18

Medicaid (**Medi-Cal** in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

California's Medi-Cal Funding

Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)

\$107.5B Federal funding (62%) \$37.6B State general fund (22%)

\$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on Silicon Valley & Salinas Valley CA-18

Diverse urban and agricultural workforce vulnerability: CA-18 spans portions of San Jose, Salinas Valley, and parts of Santa Cruz and San Benito counties, where agricultural workers, tech industry service workers, and their families depend on Medi-Cal coverage

Latino-majority district: Following 2020 redistricting, CA-18 became a Latino-majority district spanning diverse communities from urban San Jose to agricultural areas with substantial Medicaid dependence

Vulnerable populations: Healthcare access for farmworkers, service industry employees, and low-income families across the district depends on stable Medicaid funding

Critical regional healthcare hubs threatened: Facilities like Salinas Valley Health Medical Center and community health centers throughout the district rely on Medicaid reimbursements to serve both urban and rural populations

CA Congressional District 18 Medicaid/Medi-Cal Facts

Total coverage: 240,000 people

This represents 32% of the district's population

An additional 29,000+ residents receive Covered California premium subsidies

Combined, over 269,000 people (36% of the district) rely on Medi-Cal or Covered CA subsidies

Estimated enrollment breakdown:

- 84,000 children (18 and under)
- 48,000 seniors and disabled adults
- 108,000 working adults and caregivers

Economic impact: Approximately \$2.9 billion in annual Medi-Cal spending in the district

Healthcare infrastructure at risk:

- Salinas Valley Health Medical Center serves as a critical healthcare hub for the Salinas Valley region
- Community health centers throughout San Jose, Gilroy, Morgan Hill, Watsonville, and other communities serve diverse populations
- Specialty care services for vulnerable populations depend on Medicaid funding
- Rural healthcare providers serve patients traveling long distances for care



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Time to Take Action!

Potential impact of cuts: Up to \$2.5 billion in federal funding losses over nine years if cuts are applied proportionally across districts

Current Budget Process

House passed resolution calling for \$880 billion in cuts from Energy & Commerce Both chambers adopted joint budget resolution on April 10, 2025 Committee markups expected in May with final passage targeted **by Memorial Day**
