PROTECT HUD FUNDING IN CA-07: Ensuring Housing Stability for Our Communities

What is HUD? Vital Programs for CA-07 The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides crucial support through programs like:

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8): Helps low-income families afford housing.
- Continuum of Care (CoC) grants: Funds homelessness services.
- HOME & CDBG: Supports affordable housing and community development.

CA-07 Housing Needs: The Numbers Speak

- 13,084 households through Sacramento Housing Authority (payments go to landlords)
- 431 households through Yolo County Housing Authority
- Multiple households through other affiliated housing authorities in the district

Disaster Recovery & Prevention: Rebuilding Our Wildfire and Flood-Affected Communities

- Over \$1.6 billion in CDBG-DR funds for California's wildfire and flood recovery efforts
- · Sacramento County has received millions in federal disaster recovery funding
- Critical funding for flood protection in a region with high flood risk
- CDBG-DR funds support infrastructure, housing, and economic revitalization

Housing Crisis Across Our District:

- Exploding Costs: Rents up 71% since 2020.
- Wages have increased only 16% since 2020.

THE IMPOSSIBLE GAP:

- Average voucher recipient earns: \$21,412/year
- Living wage needed for family of four: \$48,740/year per adult
- Gap: Voucher recipients would need to MORE THAN DOUBLE their income

Affordable Housing Projects:

- The Lyla: 291-unit complex in Elk Grove under construction (completion expected late 2024)
- Poppy Grove: 384-unit affordable housing development (completion expected mid-2025)
- The Pardes 1: 95-unit affordable housing development (completion expected late 2025)
- Coral Blossom Apartments: 81-unit complex providing permanent housing for formerly homeless residents

Devastating Impact of Proposed HUD Cuts would severely harm our communities:

- 40% reduction in rental assistance & elimination of traditional Section 8 vouchers.
- Time limits for "able-bodied" recipients (2 years).
- \$700+ million cut from homelessness programs.

Human Impact If Funding is Reduced:

- 13,084+ households would lose housing vouchers in Sacramento County
- \$1.6+ billion in disaster recovery funds at risk
- Critical affordable housing projects like The Lyla, Poppy Grove, and The Pardes 1 jeopardized
- Increased homelessness, particularly affecting seniors and people with disabilities
- Reduced flood protection funding for a highly vulnerable region
