PROTECT HUD FUNDING IN CA-14: Ensuring Housing Stability for Our Communities

What is HUD? Vital Programs for CA-14 The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) provides crucial support through programs like:

- Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8): Helps low-income families afford housing.
- Continuum of Care (CoC) grants: Funds homelessness services.
- HOME & CDBG: Supports affordable housing and community development.

CA-14 Housing By the Numbers

Housing Choice Vouchers currently serve:

- 2,500+ households in District 14 cities via Housing Authority of Alameda County
- Serving families in Hayward, Pleasanton, Livermore, Union City, Castro Valley, and parts of Dublin and Fremont

Disaster Recovery and Community Development:

- \$8.5 million in American Rescue Plan Act funds for affordable housing in district cities
- \$3.2 million annually in CDBG, HOME, and ESG funding supports CA-14 communities

Affordable Housing Projects:

- Rocky Hill Veterans Housing 39 permanent supportive units for veterans
- Sequoia Grove (Hayward) New affordable townhomes
- · Additional developments in planning or construction across district cities

Housing Crisis Across Our District

Median home price: \$850,000+ in most district cities

Average 2-bedroom rent: \$2,500+/month

Income needed to afford rent: \$48/hour (nearly 3x minimum wage)

Housing costs up 65% since 2020 | Wages up only 18%

The Impossible Gap:

Average voucher recipient income: \$22,100/year Living wage (family of 4): \$52,400/adult/year

Voucher recipients would need to more than double their income

Vulnerable Populations Across CA-14:

Over 20,000 low-income renter households lack access to affordable housing 75% of extremely low-income households pay over 50% of income on housing 28% of renters in the district spend over 50% of income on rent

Threats to HUD Funding

Proposed cuts include:

- 40% reduction in rental assistance
- Elimination of Section 8 vouchers
- Two-year limits for "able-bodied" recipients
- Block grants with fewer federal protections
- \$700M+ cut to homelessness programs

If Funding is Reduced:

- 7,000+ households could lose housing vouchers
- \$300M+ in housing development funds would be at risk



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Time to Take Action!

- Projects like Belmont Family Apartments could be jeopardized
- 3,500+ seniors and 4,000+ disabled residents face displacement
