#### **Protect Medicaid Funding in Congressional District 10**

 Medicaid (Medi-Cal in California) provides healthcare for 15+ million Californians. Federal cuts would severely impact healthcare access statewide.

#### California's Medi-Cal Funding - Total funding: \$174.6 billion (FY 2024-25)

- \$107.5B Federal funding (62%)
- \$37.6B State general fund (22%)
- \$29.5B Local government, health plan fees, provider taxes (16%) (also under threat of cuts)

Direct Impact on Silicon Valley CA-16 - Despite its affluence CA-16 has a significant population relying on medi-cal

- Vulnerable Workforce: Many service workers, contractors, and families supporting the tech industry depend on Medi-Cal for affordable healthcare.
- **Diverse Communities at Risk:** Cities like San Jose, Mountain View, Palo Alto, Los Altos, Campbell, and coastal communities have working-class families who heavily rely on Medi-Cal.
- Threat to World-Class Medical Centers: Renowned institutions like Stanford Health Care and El Camino Health serve substantial Medi-Cal populations; cuts directly threaten their financial stability.
- Addressing Economic Disparity: Even in a wealthy district, Medi-Cal is essential for the healthcare needs of many service, hospitality, and essential workers.

**CA Congressional District 16 Medicaid/Medi-Cal Facts -** Total coverage: Approximately 205,000 people depend on Medi-Cal in CA-16.

- This represents about 27% of the district's population.
- An additional 30,000+ residents receive Covered California premium subsidies.
- Combined, over 235,000 people (31% of the district) rely on Medi-Cal or Covered California subsidies for their healthcare

#### Estimated enrollment breakdown:

- 71,750 children (18 and under)
- 41,000 seniors and disabled adults
- 92,250 working adults and caregivers

**Economic Impact -** Approximately **\$2.5 billion in annual Medi-Cal spending** directly supports the local healthcare economy and jobs within the district.

#### Healthcare Infrastructure at Risk:

- World-class medical institutions like Stanford Health Care and El Camino Health serve Medi-Cal populations, providing specialized and critical care. Their ability to do so is directly tied to stable Medicaid funding.
- **Community health centers** throughout Silicon Valley are the backbone of primary care for diverse, multilingual communities and rely heavily on Medicaid funding.
- **Kaiser Permanente facilities** and other providers depend on stable Medicaid reimbursements to continue serving a broad spectrum of the population.

**Potential impact of cuts -** The district could face up to **\$2.1 billion in federal funding losses over nine years** if cuts are applied proportionally across districts. This would be catastrophic for our healthcare system.

Essential Healthcare Services at Risk: - Cuts to Medi-Cal would jeopardize access to:

- Primary care for 205,000 residents across Silicon Valley communities.
- Emergency services at major medical centers.
- Mental health and substance use treatment services, crucial in addressing growing community needs.
- Long-term care for seniors in suburban communities, ensuring they can age with dignity.
- Maternal and child healthcare for working families, protecting the health of the next generation.
- Specialized care at academic medical centers serving the region, impacting research and advanced treatments.
